Club Meeting Minutes
05/05/2008 @ 7:30 PM Location: Aeromark

- ! Elliot Sussman, Art Rood, Steve Henderson and Russ Crawford were the board members present. Eleven other members attended the meeting.
- ! Steve opened the meeting and announced that Fred Petersen and Tom Mondada had been voted lifetime memberships in appreciation for their contributions of work and effort to get our club established in its formative years.
- ! The status of the south fence is nearly 80% complete and is being installed by the Eagle Scouts under the auspices of Loran Marler. Only two or three more strands of wire are needed to complete the job.
- ! Barry Cazier has finished the overhaul of the pump part of the irrigation pump and it is ready to be hauled out to the field.
- ! We need to get volunteers to operate the pump for field watering– which will be starting soon.
- ! Steve gave the treasurers report that we have \$2600, have spent \$600 leaving \$2000. There is \$1230 budgeted for mowing. Figuring in gas for irrigation, fertilizer, maintenance, etc. leaves us in the hole about \$90 at years end. There will likely be some late joiners to the club but we really need new members. Steve suggested that we see how things go for now.
- ! We have the OK from John Bagely to have a table at the Rexburg Air Show on July14th.
- ! It is suggested that we have the breakfast at 0800 hrs for the open house. Jim Haldy suggested that the entertainment be a balloon bust, a pylon race for slow sticks and a landing contest. Art Rood will bring a four burner stove for making coffee. The cooking team should be there a 0700 hrs. Set up assignments for various tasks.
- ! People buying gas for the pump should save their gas receipts. It may be possible to recover the state tax.
- ! Art Rood and Steve Henderson have audited our books.
- ! Jim David is doing the advertizing for the open house.
- ! Jim Haldy asked if any one is interested in dong some night flying with slow sticks? Also, pylon racing with 5 ounce electrics? They could probably be ready to fly for about \$60.
